Jack and the Beanstalk

Prep

 Cut out the Storytelling Pieces and tape them to craft sticks.

Together Time

- Give a stick puppet to each child.
- As you read, tap on the toe of the child whose story piece you name in the story.
 This child holds up the puppet.
- After the story, invite children to hold their story pieces and play follow the leader as you pretend to look for a beanstalk. Play track 4 on the Mother Goose Time Music Sampler as you march around the room.

Teacher Tip

Help children increase attention span during story time by offering them something to hold or by involving them in the story-telling process. Tell a shortened version of the story to adapt to your toddler's attention span.

Seed Count

Together Time

- Cut open a squash and invite your toddler to touch and explore the textures.
- Place two seeds next to the squash.
- Invite your toddler to pick up one seed at a time and put it in the bowl.
- Count as he picks up each seed.
- Repeat with three seeds.

Science Area

Place other types of produce in the science area to allow children to get a closer look and feel.











Garden Colors

Prep

- Cut out the game pieces.
- Fold and tape the die to assemble.

Together Time

- Look, name and point to the vegetables on the Folder Game.
- Invite your child to roll the die and identify the color.
- Ask him to place one of the game pieces on any vegetable with the matching color.
- Continue until the game pieces are all on vegetables. Play again.

Teacher Tip

Use parts or pieces of the tools provided in your Mother Goose Time kit for your own creative extension activities. For example, set the folder game aside and only use the die for a color-hunt game. Roll the die and then ask children to hunt for the same color on their clothing or on an object in the room.

Together Time

- Show your child the completed puzzle.
- Give each child a puzzle piece on a plate.
- Set out a spoon and bowl of sand for each child.
- Invite your children to use a spoon and scoop sand or dirt over the puzzle piece.
- After the children are finished scooping, invite them to dig up the carrot and place the pieces back together.
